

#### Seniors for Seniors



There are a multitude of benefits for aging seniors to adopt senior pets. For older pet owners, having a dog helps one get out of the house, meet new people, exercise and reduce stress. Owning a senior dog removes the challenges of training and obedience that are often required of younger puppies. Older dogs are calmer in temperament and provide instant companionship.

There are many national programs to support the initiative of matching senior dogs with older adults. These include <u>Paws for Seniors</u>, <u>Pets for The Elderly</u>, <u>The Grey Muzzle</u>, <u>The Animal League Senior to Senior Program</u>, <u>Hounds in Pounds Senior to Senior Program</u> and more.

Our very own office volunteer, Moira (aged 59+), recently adopted a senior beagle, Buck, through <a href="Dog World Rescue">Dog World Rescue</a> (DWR) on Facebook. DWR is a Volunteer Rescue based out of Alexandria, Virginia. They rescue dogs from high-kill shelters and find loving forever homes in the DMV area. DWR

provided Buck with a full vet check up, vaccinations, etc. Buck also came to Moira FULLY housebroken, he is friendly with cats, dogs, children, loves car rides and walks.

Buck has made a huge difference is Moira's life. "Buck helped me get off the couch and get into weight-bearing exercise like walking. Buck is outgoing and friendly so we are greeting everyone we meet," stated Moira.

At 8 years young, Buck is considered a senior pet and yet remains affectionate and playful. DWR's policy is to take Buck back and find him another home if Moira's circumstances change. DWR wants to make sure Buck does NOT ever end up in a shelter again. Many other reputable rescues offer this level of care and support. This return policy applies for all ages of dog and in sickness and in health.

Is a dog too much responsibility? Consider adopting a cat. They are independent and low maintenance. They are predictable and very happy indoors. Fancy Cats is one local rescue founded in 1997 to save cats. Fancy Cats has successfully placed over 25,000 homeless cats to date! Fancy Cats also rescues dogs.

Our pets can actually help us lower our blood pressure, reduce cholesterol, relieve stress and improve mental health. A rescued pet may rescue you.
