A word from our Executive Director Carolyn Pennington



Though Ellen had moved from client to volunteer, the extent of her dedication to Shepherd's Center did not stop there.

Ellen joined the board of directors as a liaison between the Adventures in Learning instructors and the other board members.

Now as a retired board member, Ellen reflects on her time with SCNOVA (formally SCOV), "I met so many good friends and had some truly wonderful times. This organization has enriched my life greatly."
