# SCNOVA Volunteer Highlight Corner - Tim Dodd Furthering the SCNOVA Mission through Service

Tim Dodd retired in August 2022 after serving the higher education community for nearly 40 years as an instructor and administrator. He had served as dean or director at The George Washington University, the University of Michigan, Duke University, Case Western Reserve University, Gettysburg College, St. Lawrence University, and the University of Pittsburgh. Tim served on the Board of Directors, chaired the Board, and later served as executive director of the nonprofit Center for Academic Integrity and associate director at the Kenan Institute for Ethics at Duke University. Tim served as a national expert on academic integrity issues, honor codes, and academic integrity policies and as a primary contact for universities, colleges, and high schools seeking information

and counsel on academic integrity. Tim was a frequent guest on local NPR programs around the country and was quoted in a number of national media, including the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and Time magazine. Tim earned his BA and MA at Fordham University and also completed Ph.D. coursework at the University of Pittsburgh.

After the culmination of an impressive career in education, Tim was seeking to not only remain active but influential as well. Tim initially heard about the Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia from a post via the social media site, Meet Up, advertising a volunteer social. This event served as an opportunity to meet existing SCNOVA volunteers and hear firsthand about their experience. Tim attended the event and was very impressed by the presentations as well as the empathy in the room for the older adult community. Tim was a caretaker for his father during the end of his life and these feelings resonated with him as well. Tim was moved to volunteer but wanted to contribute more. Tim joined the Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia as not only a driver volunteer but a member of the Board of Directors.

Tim expressed that the highlight of his experience volunteering with SCNOVA thus far has been the gratitude from participants and being a direct beneficiary of that gratitude. "The entire experience has been quite meaningful. One participant even packed me lunch! We are meeting a tangible need that is directly extending the independence of the older adults in the communities we serve. Witnessing the gratitude first-hand has been such a pleasure."

Tim hopes that voicing his experience will edge SCNOVA closer to gaining more volunteers and truly fulfilling the vision of transforming aging into an empowering experience for older adults to live a life of meaning.



### **Ingredients:**

- 1 cucumber, thinly sliced into halfmoons
- 1/2 red onion, thinly sliced
- 1 pt. grape or cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 cup halved Kalamata olives
- 6 oz. feta, cut into 1/2" cubes
- 2 Tbsp. red wine vinegar
- Juice of 1/2 lemon
- 1 tsp. dried oregano
- · Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil



#### **Directions:**

- 1. In a large bowl, toss cucumber, onion, tomatoes, and olives. Gently fold in feta.
- 2. In a small bowl, whisk vinegar, lemon juice, and oregano until combined; season with salt and pepper. Slowly stream in oil, whisking until dressing is smooth and emulsified.
- 3. Drizzle dressing over salad and toss again to combine.
